(List B) *Ecossaise in G* by Beethoven

What does the title mean?

An 'ecossaise' is a French version of a Scottish country dance. 'In G' means the piece is in G major

What key is this in?

G major

No key changes – the sharps are just accidentals

Notation:

2/4 – simple duple – 2 crotchet beats per bar Metronome marking – 100 crotchets per minute (c=circa = round about)

Sharp sign – raise the note by a semitone

mf – mezzo forte = moderately loud f – forte = loud p - piano = soft cres - crescendo = gradually getting louder

accent - accent the note, play it louder staccato – short and detatched slurs – legato – smooth and well connected Repeat sign – repeat the music D.C. al fine - play from the beginning to Fine Fine - finish

Need to know note names (pitch) and note values (rhythm) including rests.
