Etude in E minor Op 46 No 7 by Stephen Heller

What does the title mean?

Etude is French for study. A study is a piece that builds a specific technique. This piece works on fast fingerwork and dynamic contrasts. This piece is like a tarentella.

What key is this in?

This is in E minor. Bars 1 to 2 are A minor Bars 3 to 4 are G major Bars 5 onwards E minor There are moments of A minor (eg bars 36-37) but the piece basically remains in E minor.

Notation:

Vivace - spirited/livelv Metronome marking - 66 dotted minims per minute 6/8 - compound duple - 6 quavers per bar Legato - smooth and well-connected Piano - p - soft Slur - play legato Tie - hold the notes for their combined value Sharp - raise the note a semitone Natural - cancel the sharp or flat Mezzo forte - mf - moderately loud Accent - play the note loudly Staccato - short and detached Fortepiano - fp - loud then immediately soft Crescendo - gradually getting louder Pedal marking - use the damper pedal Diminuendo - gradually getting softer Forte - f - loud Sforzando - sf - suddenly loud
