Minuet in G minor BWV 842 (Bach)

What does the title mean?

A minuet is a graceful French dance in triple time. This piece is from the notebook made by JS Bach for his son WF Bach.

What key is this in? G minor Bars 7-9 are in Bb major (the relative major) Bars 10-13 C minor (sub-dominant minor) Remainder is in G minor

Notation:

NB Most of the markings are editorial (Bach did not write these)
Metronome marking 80 crotchets per minute
Sempre legato e espressivo - always smooth, well-connected and expressive
3/4 - 3 crotchets per bar (simple triple time)
1st and 2nd time endings
Repeat - repeat the section
Sharp - raise the note a semitone
Natural - cancel the sharp or flat
Flat - lower the note a semitone

Piano - p - soft

Crescendo - gradually getting louder Mezzo forte - mf - moderately loud

Tie - hold the notes for their combined value

Tenuto - stress the note by holding it for its full value

Pianissimo - pp - very soft

Fermata - pause - hold the note longer than written. For this piece, the sign means pause before playing the next piece and signifies the end of the piece.
