Sizilianisch Op 68 No 11 - Robert Schumann

What does the title mean?

Sizilianisch or siciliano is a style of 6/8 music from Sicily. In the Baroque period, sicilianos were pastoral/gentle in style using dotted rhythms. This piece is roguish and so is more playful in character.

What is the key?

This is in A minor but finishes on the dominant E at bar 25. The middle section is in A minor bars 26 to 29 and then B minor bars 30 to 33, back to A minor.

Notation:

Schalkhaft (Scherzando) - playful, joke-like 6/8 - time signature - compound duple time p - piano - soft staccato - short and detached slur - play legato mezzo staccato/portato - semi-detatched notes crescendo - gradually getting louder f - forte - loud martellato ^ - hammered accent fermata - pause, hold the note longer than written

Fine - finish L'istesso tempo - at the same speed 2/4 - time signature - simple duple

mf - mezzo forte - moderately loud

D.C. al Fine (da capo al Fine) - return to the beginning and play to the end (Fine) senza replica - without repeating

senza replica - without repeatin

acciaccatura - quick short note before the main note

accent (marcato) > - stress the note
